

## **Tennant Checklist for Preventing Mold**

Landlords and tenants share the responsibility of preventing moisture and mold in a rental home. Help yourself and your landlord by following these steps to keep your apartment clean and dry. A landlord can't fix what they don't know about.

	turn on bathroom ventilation fan when snowering.
	Turn on kitchen ventilation fan when cooking.
	If using a humidifier, regularly clean and inspect the area around it for moisture damage.
	Keep plants requiring watering off of carpeted and wood floored areas unless adequate moisture protection is down.
	Clean up any water spill or leak immediately, especially around the tub, sink, toilet, washing machine, and plants.
	Dry all wetted areas, especially carpets and furniture, quickly and thoroughly.
	Clean showers and tubs regularly.
	Vacuum at least once a week.
	Clean refrigerator regularly, inside and out.
	Clean washer and dryers around doors, and by lint screen.
	Refrain from growing cannabis or other agriculture inside the home, garage, attic, and basements.
	Detach exterior garden hoses and turn off hose bibs before freezing temperatures
	Do not store wet snow gear in closets or areas where they will remain wet or impact the home.
Check the following areas for moisture or leaks:	
	Pipes under sinks and by washing machine
	Window and door frames
	Ceilings and walls
	Basement and attic
	By slider and entry doors
	Around toilets
	Next to showers and bathtubs

Notify the landlord immediately if you see a problem! Most mold contractors and inspectors will not work for a tenant without the landlord's authorization.
